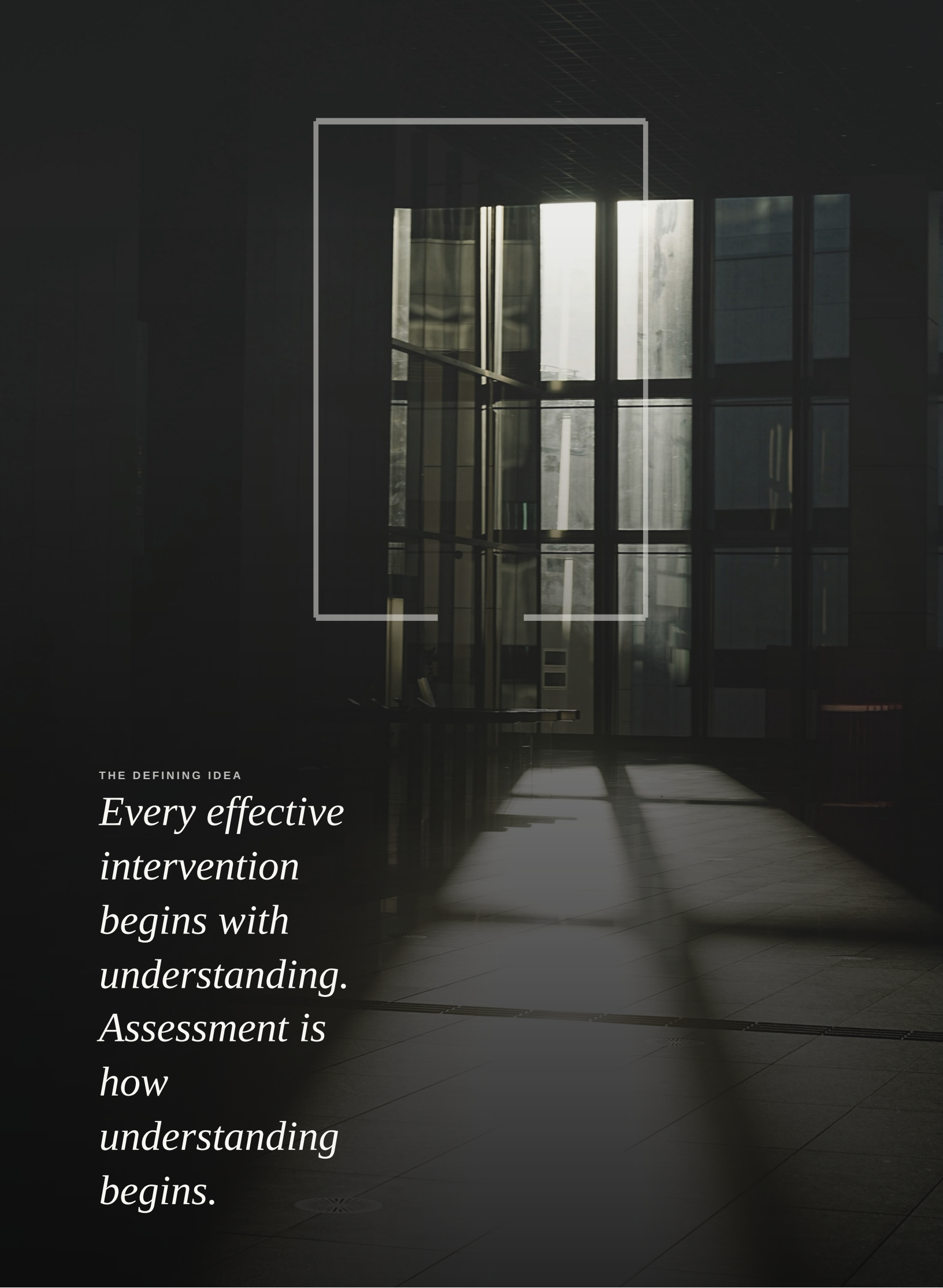

Before organisations can improve, they must first understand the conditions producing the outcomes they experience today. This publication explains why Forge always begins there.

The Philosophy explained why Forge exists. The Model explained how Forge understands organisations. The Method explained how Forge approaches change.

This volume explains the first and most important part of that change. Before anything else, Forge assesses.

It explains why assessment matters and what it produces. It does not explain how a Forge Assessment is actually conducted. That practice belongs to a separate, internal document.

An assessment is not a survey.

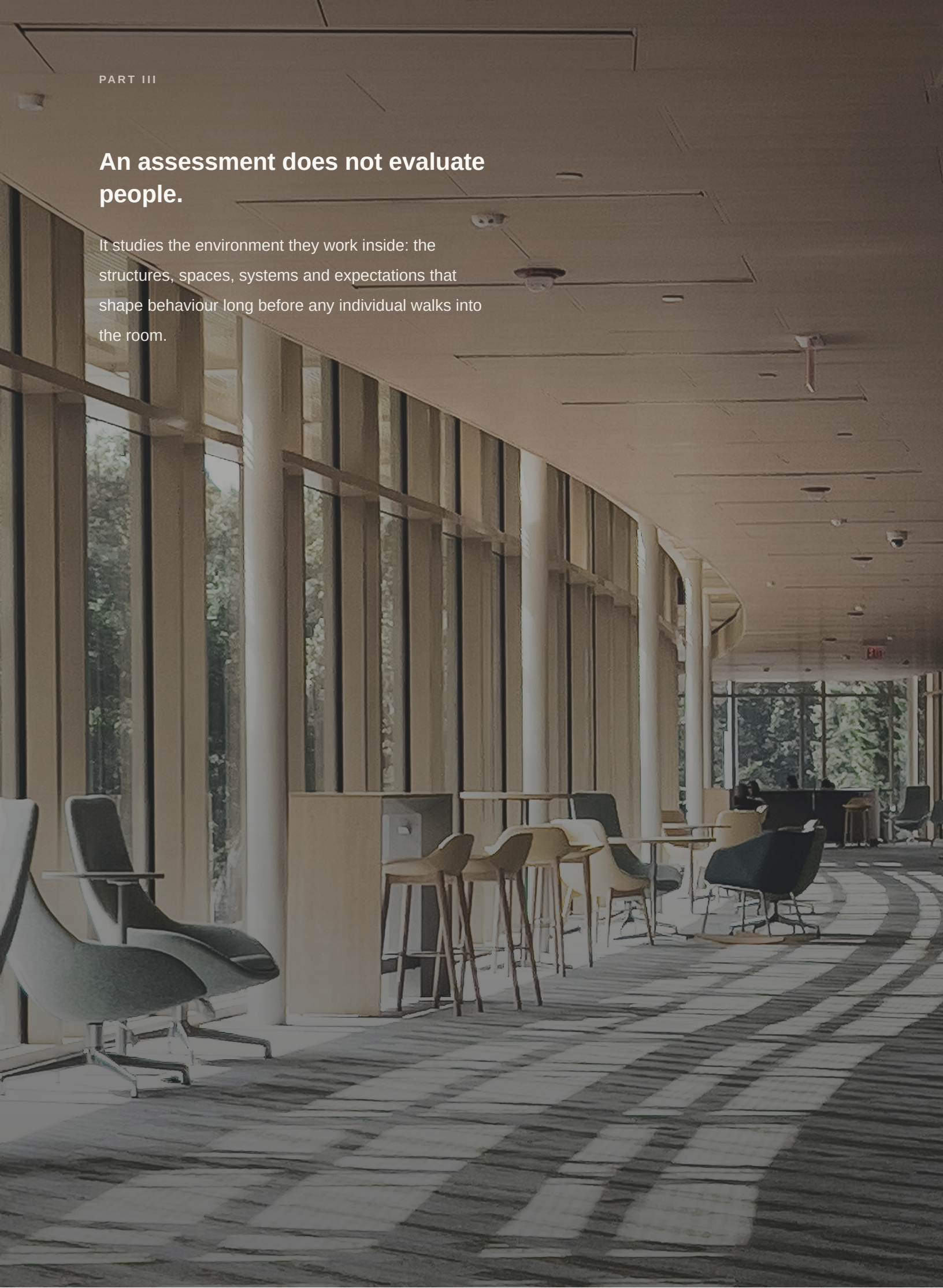
It is a structured way of observing the conditions shaping how your organisation already behaves, before anyone changes anything. It looks at the room before it asks about the people in it.

Measures opinions	Observes conditions
Starts with a survey	Starts with observation
Produces a score	Produces understanding
Ends the process	Begins the process
Focuses on people	Focuses on environment

An assessment does not evaluate people.

It studies the environment they work inside: the structures, spaces, systems and expectations that shape behaviour long before any individual walks into the room.



The same five-stage model introduced in Volume 02 governs how Forge reads every environment it assesses.

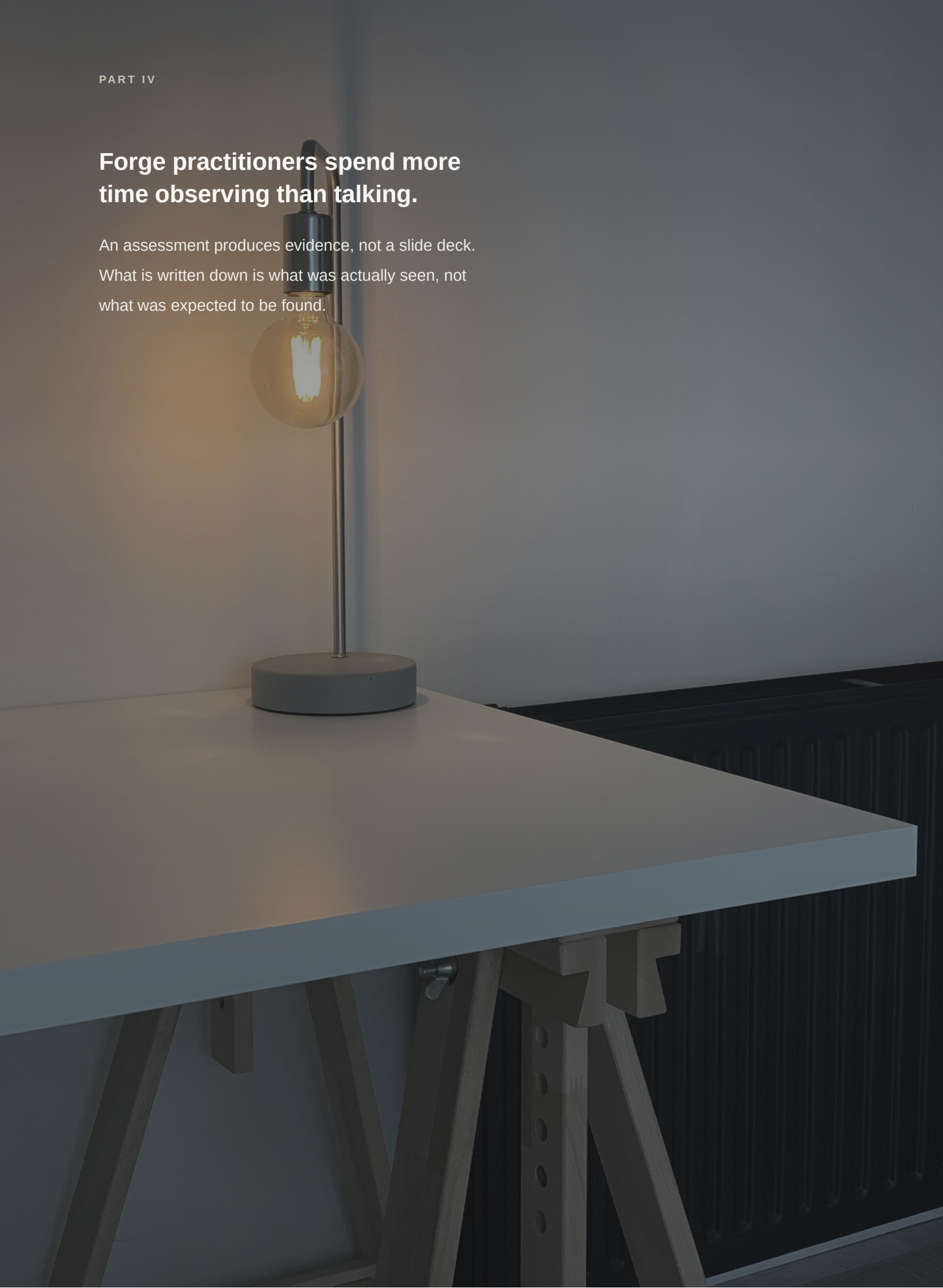

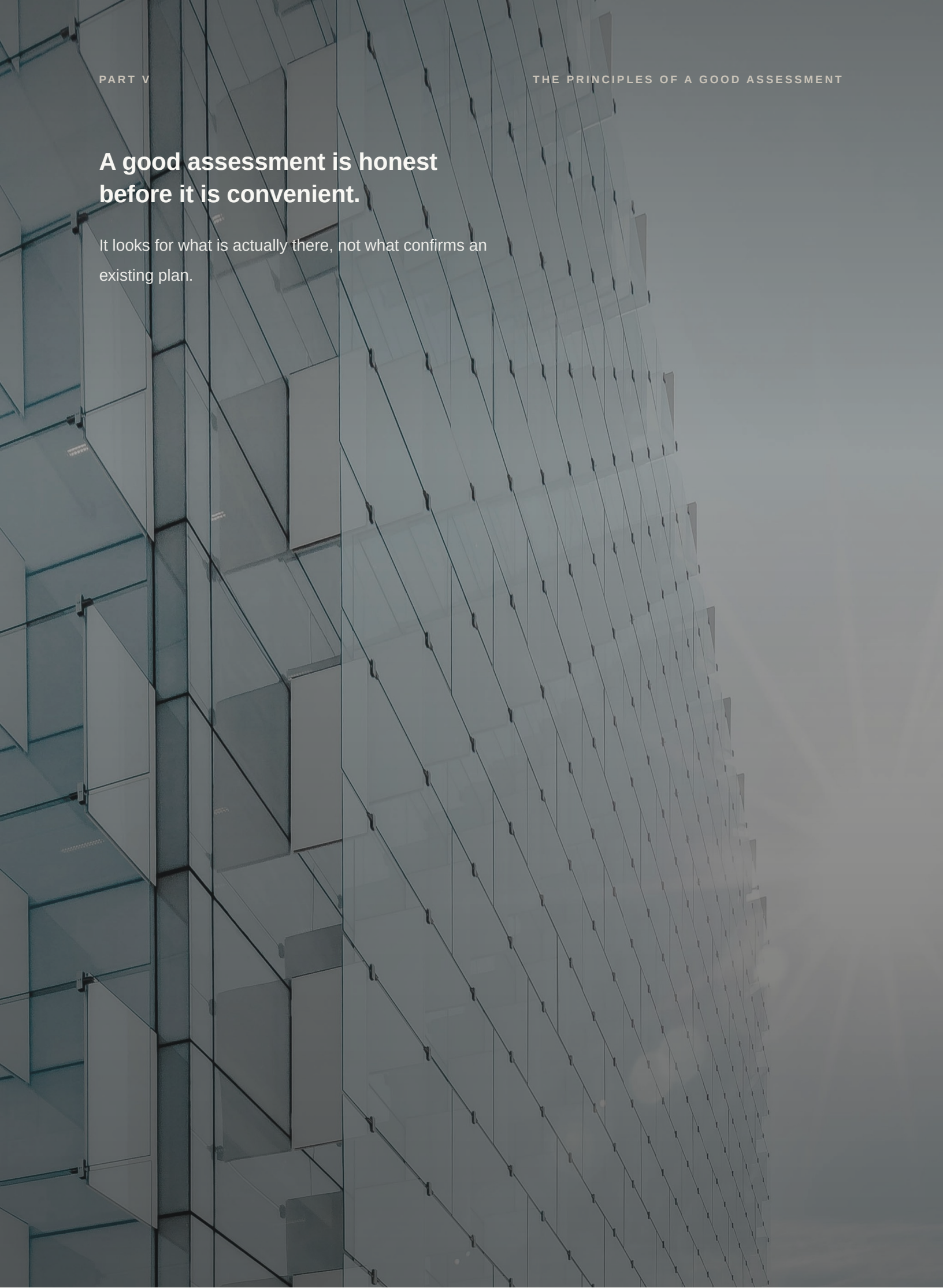
Forge practitioners spend more time observing than talking.

An assessment produces evidence, not a slide deck.
What is written down is what was actually seen, not
what was expected to be found.



A good assessment is honest before it is convenient.

It looks for what is actually there, not what confirms an
existing plan.



PRINCIPLE	WHAT IT MEANS
Observation before opinion	We describe what we see before we judge it
Evidence before conclusion	Every finding can be traced back to something observed
The environment, not the individual	We assess conditions, not people
Understanding before recommendation	No change is proposed until the environment is understood

A Forge Assessment produces a clear account of what your environment is currently producing, and why.

Not a diagnosis of your people. A description of the conditions they are working inside.



An assessment does not end with a report.

It ends with a clearer view of the environment that needs to change, and the first evidence of what that change should actually be.
